Player Requirements:

Registration:

If selected in a Bruins Junior Representative Team you must be registered with BNSW & Bankstown and this is the responsibility of the individual to organise.

Trainings:-

Representative Season:

- Bruins Representative Teams will commence back early in 2022 [Date to be confirmed]
- BNSW Waratah JPL & MJL Pre-season will run for approx. 3 weeks. These games will be held on a Saturday afternoon & Sunday.
- Teams that qualify for BNSW Junior Premier League [JPL] will be required to play 3 central venue rounds which maybe in the country and will require team travel as they will play games on Saturday and Sunday.
- The BNSW Waratah Metro Junior League [MJL] games are played on a Sunday within the metro area.
- BNSW JPL & MJL season commences in March and concludes in September.
- Usually there are no games scheduled on the middle weekend of the school holidays for juniors, however it is a good idea to wait until the official draw is released to plan any holidays.
- Qualifying teams for the Australian Under 14 Club Championships are played in the September / October school holidays.

BNSW Waratah JPL games will be played against Metro teams on a Sunday and game times may range from 8am to 4pm. The game will last about a 1½ to 2 hours and players will need to be at the venue atleast 45minutes prior to game time. Games against Country teams will be played at Central Venues.

BNSW Waratah MJL games are played on a Sunday and game times may range from 8am to 4pm. The game will last about a 1½ to 2 hours and players will need to be at the venue atleast 45minutes prior to game time.

Home games are played at the Bankstown Basketball Stadium, however away games may involve travel to any of the following competing MJL & JPL Metro Associations venues:-

Blacktown West Storm, Blue Mountains Magic, Camden Valley Wildfire, Glebe Spirit, Hawkesbury Jets, Hills Hornets, Hornsby Spiders, Macarthur Heat, Manly Sea Eagles, Norths Bears, Penrith Panthers, Inner West Bulls, Springwood Scorchers, St George, Sutherland Sharks, Sydney Comets.

Eligibility of Player

To be eligible for selection Parents/Guardian and players must:

- Commit to attend training twice a week & all games.
- Commit to play all Representative Games Home & Away
- Acknowledge that they are prepared to abide by the rules, policy and guidelines set down by Bankstown Basketball Association by signing the Representative Player Agreement.
- Acknowledgement by parents of a junior player that they are prepared to abide by the rules, policy and guidelines set down by Bankstown Basketball Association by signing the Representative Player Agreement.
- Be registered with Bankstown Basketball Association
- Must attend all trials as set by Bankstown Basketball Association [any absences must be explained, communicated to and approved]
- Must play in the BBA Local Competition.
- Pay the appropriate fees.
- Parents must agree to do Scorebench on a rostered basis.
- Teams rostered to Floor wipe at One Senior Representative game held at home.
